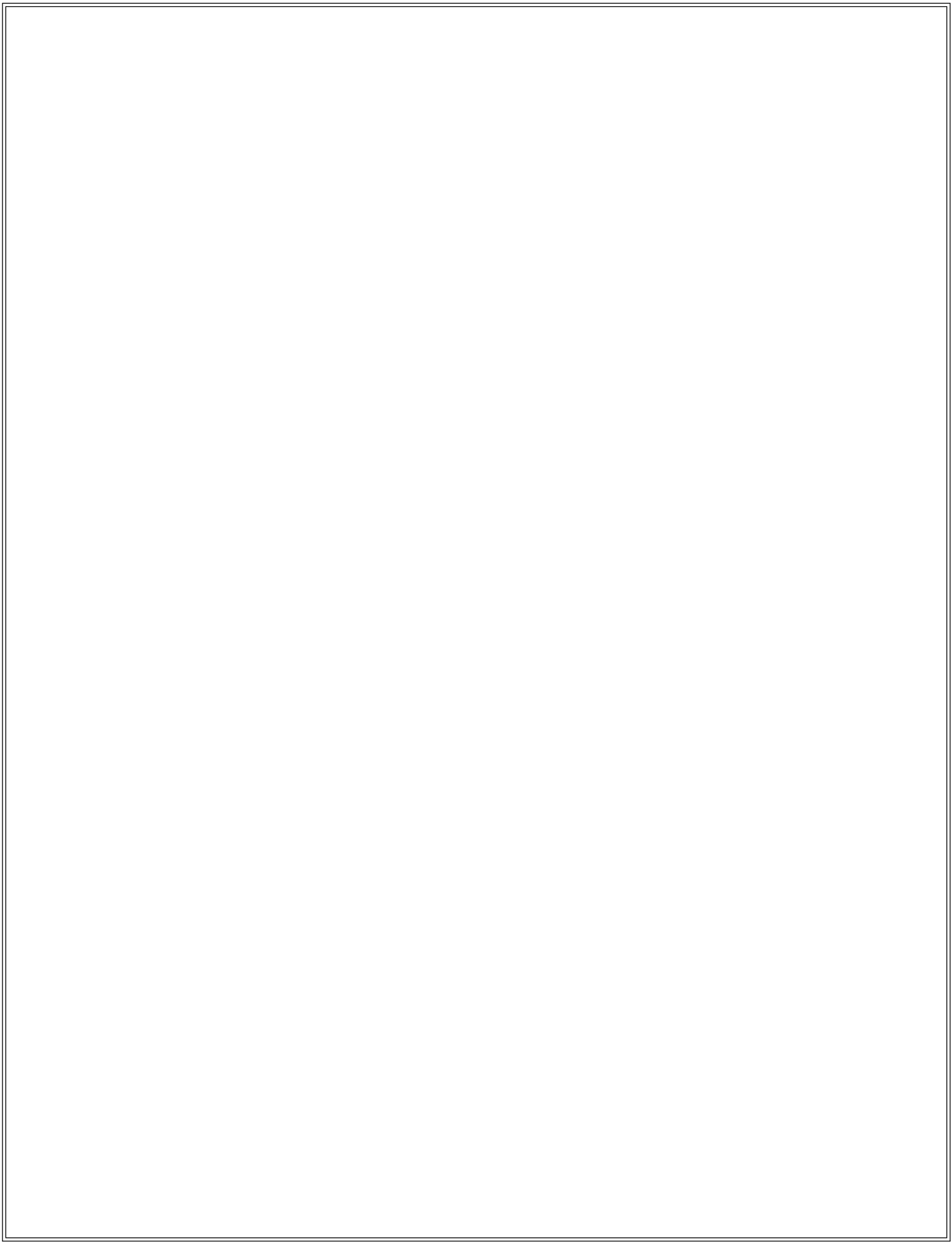

PRESIDENT'S WELCOME/MOT DE BIENVENUE DU PRÉSIDENT

Welcome to the 3rd Annual Conference of the Association for Nonprofit and Social Economy Research/Association de recherche sur les organismes sans but lucratif et sur l'économie sociale (ANSER-ARES). This year's conference at Concordia involves an exciting mix of presentations in panels



and roundtables. Our keynote speaker is Henry Mintzberg, the distinguished professor from McGill University's business school, who will speak on Wednesday, June 2nd, 4 pm on the Social Sector in a Balanced Society. Earlier that day, at 12.30 just prior to the Annual General Meeting, we will have a guest lecture from Nancy Neamtan, the Executive Director of le Chantier de l'économie sociale, on Building a movement for economic democracy: The Quebec social economy. On Thursday, June 3rd, we are holding a banquet with the Canadian Association for the Study of Co-operation at the Hotel Nouvel in which Hélène Simard, présidente-directrice générale of the Conseil québécois de la coopération et de la mutualité, will present upon Québec's dynamic co-operative sector.

ANSER-ARES is a grab-bag of researchers from diverse fields who address issues related to nonprofits, co-operatives and the social economy. Many of the researchers are involved in community economic development and related issues such as community organizing. 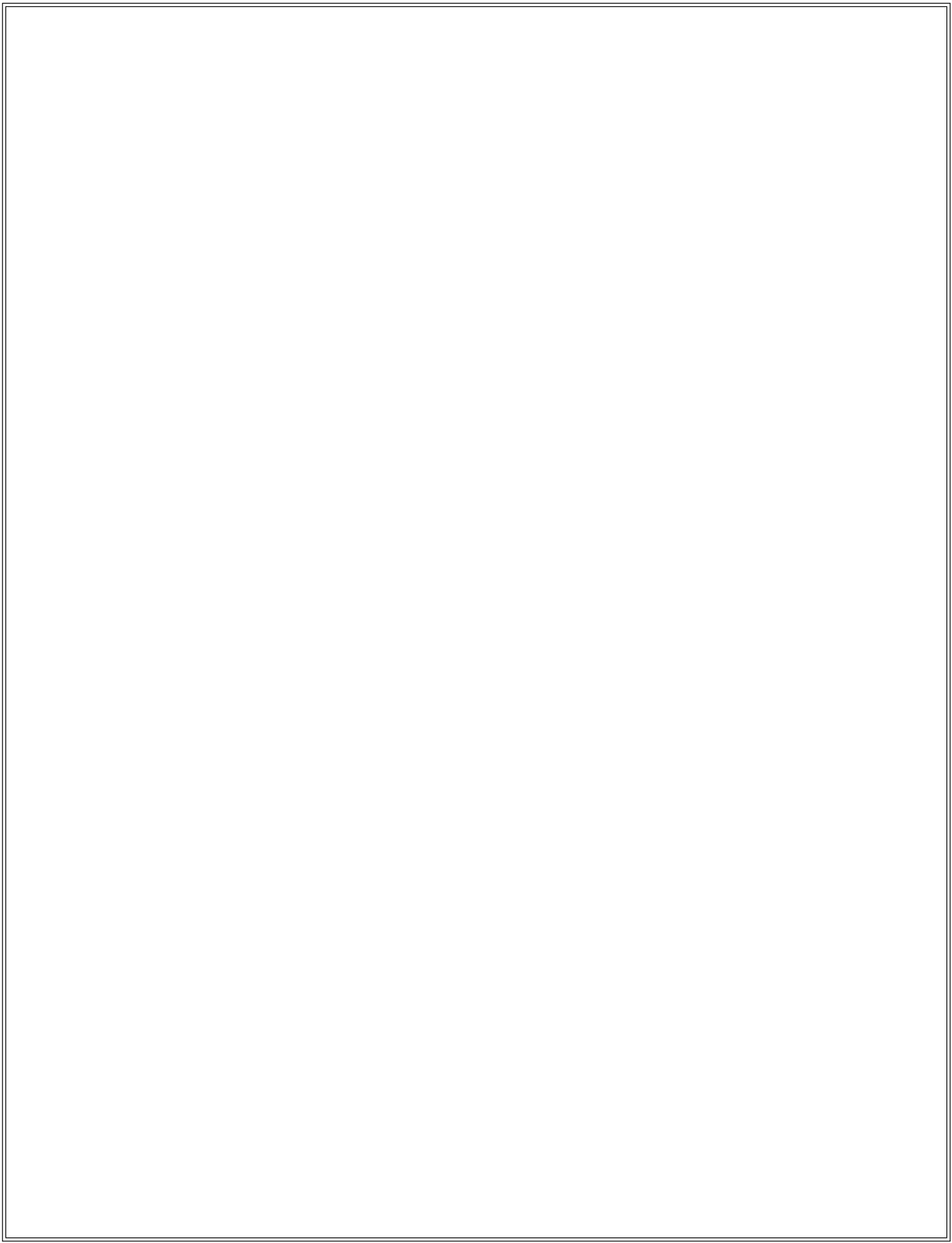
